## Free cancer screenings are available!

If you don't have health insurance, you probably feel left out of the health care system. A busy schedule, limited transportation or a tight budget can make regular check-ups and health screenings seem like luxuries.

That's where we can help. Inspira's Cancer Services team offers free cancer screenings to eligible residents of Cumberland and Gloucester counties at many convenient locations.

Inspira provides free prostate cancer education and screenings to men, ages 50 to 64 (or younger if clinically indicated), who don't have health insurance and earn a fairly low income. Colon and rectal cancer tests are also provided at no charge to men who qualify. Women can receive breast exams, Pap tests, mammograms and colon cancer tests.

Free screenings are made possible through the New Jersey Cancer Education and Early Detection Program (NJCEED), which can be found in every county in New Jersey. The NJCEED program is funded by the New Jersey Department of Health, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, and Inspira Health Network.

Inspira is dedicated to the prevention and early detection of cancer in our communities. Our cancer experts also provide important information about prevention, risk factors and cancer treatment options.

## Why are cancer screenings so important?

Each year, thousands of New Jersey residents are diagnosed with cancer. When cancer is detected early, it usually can be treated more effectively. Regular cancer screenings are the best way to detect cancer early.

## Does the NJCEED program pay for treatment?

Treatment for breast and cervical cancers detected through the NJCEED program is covered through a special Medicaid waiver program. NJCEED staff members will assist men and women, diagnosed with cancer, through the NJCEED program to find treatment in a timely manner. For those cancers not covered by this program, county residents can seek assistance through New Jersey's Charity Care and other assistance programs.
