### South Jersey family,

Just as the year before, 2021 tested resilience, spurred innovation and fostered camaraderie. And while much of the pandemic was still relatively new and unfolding in real time, major strides—both across the nation and at Inspira Health—were made in creating safer and healthier communities.

Following the Emergency Use Authorization of the Pfizer-BioNTech and Moderna COVID-19 vaccines late last year, and Johnson & Johnson in early 2021, distribution was a primary conversation driver among health care professionals, the community and the media. After months of painful loss, there was finally a necessary and meaningful line of defense against this virus—and Inspira Health continues to play a smart, strategic and integral role in providing the vaccine to those eligible in our community. Over the past year, we've established and maintained safe protocols through the vaccination pods; navigated a temporary shortage and a havoc-weakening variant; vaccinated over 92% of staff and eligible adults in the community; administered booster shots; and (most recently) vaccinated children as young as 5 years old. In fact, Inspira was the very first to offer appointments for children—ahead of CHOP, Nemours and Virtua.

While combating COVID-19 has been at the forefront of our efforts, we've continued to innovate and adapt care—and access to it—to ensure an elevated patient experience. This past year, we've welcomed new talent, expanded our geographical footprint to more than 200 locations, and have acquired and started to utilize new technology—from rapid-response EEG technology, to expanded access to telehealth, to a partnership with Monarch on a new robotic bronchoscopy and more—all to deliver on our promise of providing high-quality care right in our patients' backyards.

Beyond providing high-quality care to our patients, a core tenet of Inspira's mission is providing support for our community. When Tropical Storm Ida devastated our community this past fall, Inspira leaned in to help assist local governments, aiding in cleanup and delivering supplies to those in need. In addition, as the opioid epidemic rages on and gun violence continues to be a growing problem within our community, Inspira is serving as a resource, providing necessary kits and training to ensure incident preparedness.



These past two years have brought forth pivotal shifts externally—primarily in the health care space, but also in social justice—as well as internally. To ensure Inspira is set up to care for the changing needs of our community and sustain our organizational growth, we put together a strategic plan to guide us over the next three years, along with a re-imagined mission, vision and values to reflect the current and future state of Inspira. As we move into 2022, we are taking the vision outlined in the strategic plan and leveraging the tactics that will best help us achieve those goals through “Operational Advantage.”

While there are a number of milestones to be celebrated from the past year, and much to look forward to in 2022, the common denominator of that success is our staff. Thank you ALL for playing such a critical role in being part of, and creating, a safer, healthier South Jersey.

# Adapting with New Technology

As part of our mission to create the highest quality patient experience in the region, Inspira introduced new technologies and treatment options in 2021.

## [IS Scheduling Platform](#)

With the growing community need for access to vaccines, Inspira created the Information Systems (IS) Scheduling Platform. This platform provided community members with a portal to schedule their vaccine appointments at our PODs with ease and accessibility.

## [Ceribell Rapid Response EEG](#)

Inspira Medical Centers Mullica Hill and Vineland became two of the first hospitals in New Jersey to introduce the new Ceribell Rapid Response EEG monitoring device for effective neurological patient management. The device uses a headband with integrated electrodes, a pocket-sized recorder with intuitive adaptive software, and a virtual dashboard for remote viewing.



## [Lymphedema Testing with ImpediMed SOZO](#)

In 2021, Inspira introduced the ImpediMed SOZO device—a technology that can detect lymphedema in at-risk breast cancer survivors before symptoms develop. The device allows clinicians to discover small changes in fluid and take steps to reduce the risk of patients developing clinically significant lymphedema.





### **Monarch Navigational Bronchoscopy Platform**

Inspira was one of the first 100 hospitals nationwide to adopt the new Monarch navigational bronchoscopy platform, allowing earlier, more accurate lung cancer diagnoses. The minimally invasive procedure uses a long, flexible, robot-assisted tube to help physicians view the inside of the lungs and retrieve samples of suspected cancer tissue.

### **Spiration Valve System**

Until now, patients with stage three or four chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD) have been too ill for surgery. But the Spiration Valve System, a minimally invasive procedure conducted at Inspira, may provide these patients relief. The system consists of a series of expandable valves that help clear fluid from the lungs while simultaneously redirecting airflow, ultimately increasing a patient's air lung capacity and flowthrough.



### **Coronary Calcium Scoring**

For years, stress tests and ECGs were the primary tests for early detection of heart disease. Now, there is a more accurate screening method for those with an intermediate risk profile—coronary calcium score testing. This test identifies the amount of calcium buildup in the coronary artery using a low-dose CT scan. A patient's coronary calcium score indicates their 10-year risk level of developing heart disease, which can determine what lifestyle changes or interventions are necessary to reduce this risk.

### **Telemedicine**

The pandemic showed us just how much value telemedicine and virtual visits could bring to patient care and accessibility. Inspira provided more than 254,000 telemedicine visits in 2021. Telemedicine visits are available for Inspira Health Primary Care, Urgent Care, Behavioral Health and select specialties.

# Working Through the Pandemic

This year, as we continued the fight against COVID-19, Inspira quickly adapted to meet the needs of the community—from widespread vaccine distribution to the development of educational resources to supporting frontline workers.



## The COVID-19 Vaccine

Vaccination is the greatest defense we have against the pandemic. This year, we've administered hundreds of thousands of COVID vaccines through our points-of-distribution (PODs) and our community outreach program. Our mobile vaccine clinic has visited schools, community events,

businesses and nursing homes throughout the South Jersey region. And we've even reached hundreds of homebound patients directly in their homes.

While we initially distributed the Pfizer-BioNTech vaccine under an Emergency Use Authorization (EUA), the FDA fully approved the vaccine for use in adults age 16 and older on August 23, 2021. As of May, we've vaccinated adolescents ages 12 to 15 and, as of early November, children ages 5 to 11, under the EUA. Inspira is providing all 4 EUA COVID vaccines (Pfizer adult, Moderna, J&J, and peds Pfizer) in order to facilitate increased vaccination rates. Third doses, for certain adults who are immunocompromised, and booster shots, for adults who received their second dose of a two-dose vaccine more than six months ago or only dose of a one-dose vaccine more than two months ago, have also been given an EUA and are currently being administered to those eligible.

As of October 15, 2021, following a statewide vaccine mandate for health care workers, all Inspira workers must be vaccinated against COVID-19. Those who have approved religious and medical exemptions must submit a weekly rapid test.

## Employee Redeployment

It's important to recognize the hard work of all Inspira staff members during this past year. Many of our team members filled in where the highest need was, whether that was working in the vaccine clinics, picking up extra shifts in the emergency department or stepping into a new role as part of a cleaning crew.

## From Our Experts Series

To better educate our community, this year we launched the *From Our Expert* series of videos – covering topics like COVID-19 vaccine safety **and** how clinical trials work.

## Blue Hearts for Heroes

As health care workers around the world continue to put their own health at risk to treat patients during the pandemic, we continue to express our immense gratitude. This year, our Blue Hearts for Heroes campaign allowed the community to show their support and thanks for all health care workers by displaying blue hearts in their windows and on social media.

As part of the Blue Hearts for Heroes campaign, Southern New Jersey Steel Co. donated a 5,000-pound blue steel heart to display at Inspira Medical Center Vineland.

## COVID Response Equipment

In April, the Inspira emergency medical services (EMS) team received \$1.3 million in new equipment as part of a grant from the CARES Act. The purpose of this grant was to expand the NJ EMS Task Force (NJEMSTF) teams' capabilities statewide to address pandemic-related responses.





# Giving Back to Our Community

Inspira Health is dedicated to giving to those who are in need of support through our Community Benefit programs.

## NARCAN Distribution

A lifesaving drug that can reverse the effects of opioid overdose, typically carried by first responders and now distributed widely throughout communities to use in emergency situations. We distributed more than 500 doses in 2021.



## Deterra Distribution

A method for safe at-home medication disposal, which can reduce environmental impacts and prevent drug addiction by deactivating unused prescription drugs. We distributed 3,600 pouches in 2021.

## Health Equity

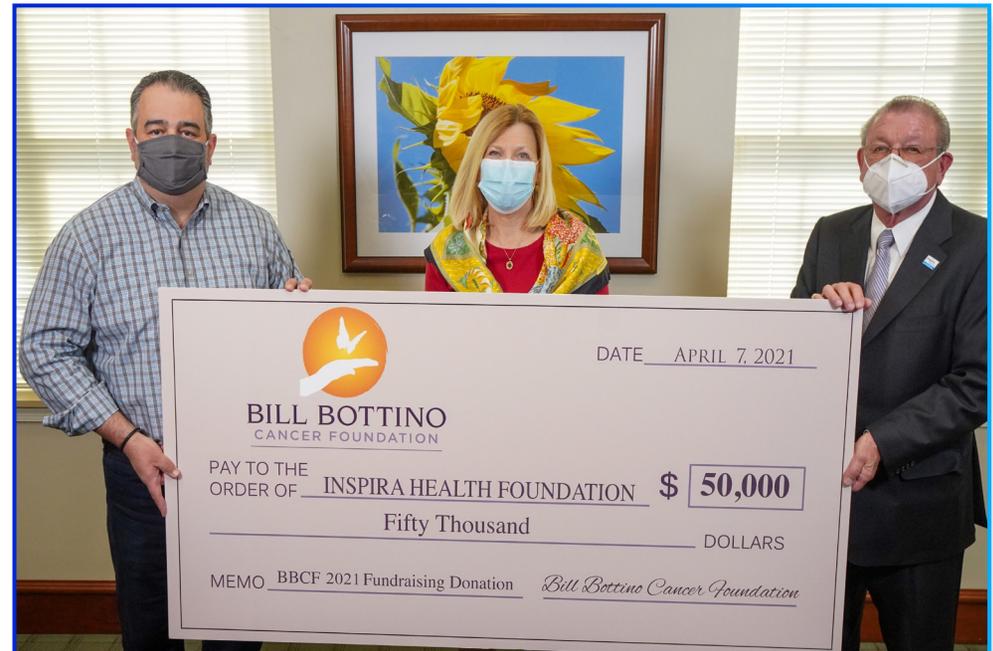
Inspira Health is committed to giving all patients equal access to the best care in the South Jersey region. One way we embraced our vision in 2021 was by celebrating Pride Month and acknowledging the health care disparities that LGBTQ+ people face.

## Accountable Health Communities

Inspira partnered with Camden Coalition’s Accountable Health Communities, a program that identifies and addresses the health-related social needs of Medicare and Medicaid beneficiaries. Those eligible are offered navigation services to address issues including housing, food, transportation, utilities and interpersonal violence.

## Bill Bottino Cancer Foundation

Named for their patriarch who lost his life to cancer in 2006, the Bottino family has supported Inspira’s Cancer Services with numerous donations, totaling \$500,000 in 2021. These funds provide patients with financial assistance for essential non-medical bills such as food, household supplies and utilities. The funds also assist clinical and support services provided at Inspira’s Frank and Edith Scarpa Regional Cancer Pavilion in Vineland.



## Tropical Storm Ida

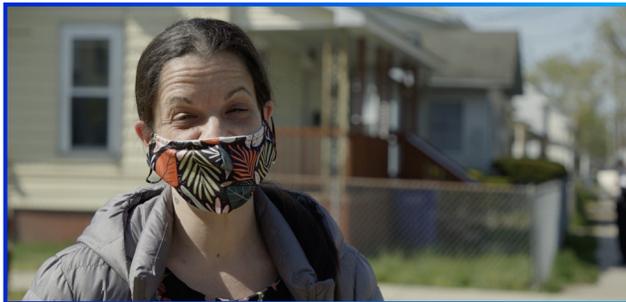
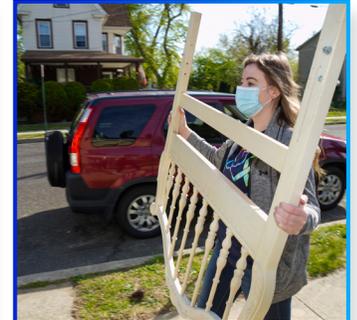

## Thanksgiving Meal Delivery

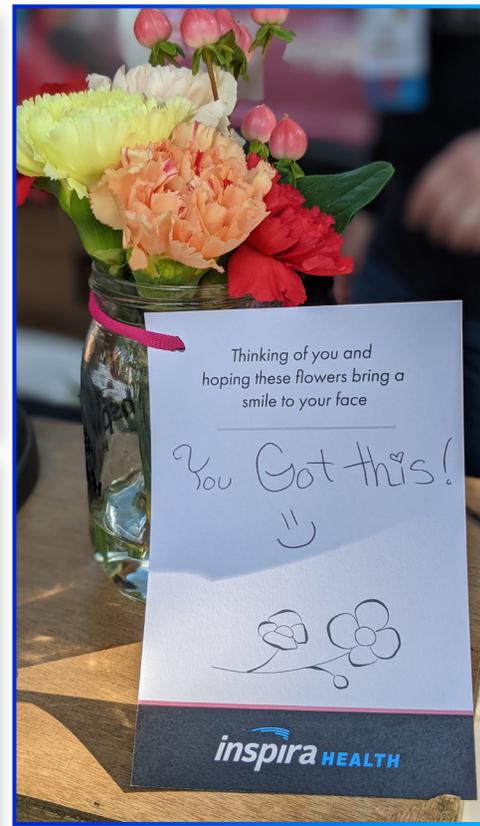

Inspira Health relies on funds from the Foundation to provide the highest-quality care to support our patients, advance technology and fund facility enhancements.

Here are some of our accomplishments in 2021.



### *Employee Emergency Assistance Fund*

Inspira Health Foundation established the Employee Emergency Assistance Fund in response to Tropical Storm Ida, a devastating natural disaster that impacted many Inspira Health team members. The fund provides financial support to Inspira employees facing unexpected hardships—such as the loss of their home in a natural disaster, insurmountable funeral costs from the sudden death of a spouse or growing medical bills from a sick child. Since its establishment in September 2021, the Employee Emergency Assistance Fund has raised more than \$10,000 from nearly 100 donors.

### *The “ALL in!” Employee Giving Campaign*

The “ALL in!” Employee Giving Campaign runs annually from the first week of September through Giving Tuesday (the Tuesday after Thanksgiving). In 2021, more than 500 employees participated in the “ALL in!” campaign. The Inspira Health Foundation thanks those employees who have gone above and beyond to support the development of our non-profit health care network.

### *Signature Events*

The funds raised by Inspira Health Foundation’s annual Golf Classic and Golf Tournament help us to provide the highest quality health care to those living in our region. In May 2021, the Golf Classic, held at Tavistock Country Club, exceeded expectations by raising over \$215,600. And in September 2021, the Golf Tournament, held at Seaview Hotel and Golf Club, raised more than \$250,700 to support health and wellness in our community.
